Have a nice meal	<i>Eet smakelijk*</i>

* Before every meal it's a Dutch custom to wish each other a good meal. *Have a nice meal or diner*. And afterwards we never forget to wish other people well. It is very impolite to forget. So please remember and don't forget it whenever you visit the Netherlands.

Dutch habit

To end this newsletter I'll explain another Dutch habit.

Americans like to hug good friends. We only hug very very good friends, but we kiss everyone. Doing this in our own Dutch style: give the other one 3 kisses on the cheeks. Left-right-left. Or, and this is the tricky part, right-left-right. Please be careful during practice!
